Barriers to achievement

Barriers to achievement in our school typically are:

- Less time spent at Early Years provision to secure school readiness
- Inability to access home learning
- Reduced access to resources at home
- Less able to afford school uniform and sports kit
- Reduced access to one to one time with an adult
- Less opportunity for enrichment visits
- Less access to transport to enrich the curriculum
- Less time to practise skills at home
- Poor attendance parents' poor perception of school based own school experiences
